Kenneth Thomas National President

Kenneth J. Thomas is the National President of NARFE, the largest federal employee and retiree organization dedicated to protecting the earned rights and benefits of America's active and retired federal workers. Thomas began his federal career in 1968 at the Rehabilitation Services Administration. For the next 35 years, he would serve in management and executive capacities that spanned areas of program management, training, compliance and management information systems (MIS). Among his notable projects, Thomas developed an application used by state governments to manage, track and report client services to the Department of Education and Social Security Administration, coordinated the District of Columbia's city-wide compliance with the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and implemented government service programs for physically, mentally and emotionally challenged individuals in federal and state prisons.

A NARFE member since 2004, Thomas volunteered in numerous national and state events within the organization. As host chairperson for FEDcon18: NARFE's premier training conference, the 2017 NARFE Federation Presidents and National Executive Board (NEB) meeting, 2014 NARFE National Convention, 2013 NARFE Federation Presidents and NEB meeting and the 2012 and 2013 Florida Federation Conventions, he coordinated local logistics, events and publicity in support of annual meetings.

His many leadership roles within NARFE include positions as Florida Federation President, Executive Vice President, District VI Vice President, District IX Vice President, Chapter President, Chapter Vice President and Chapter Legislative Officer. Additionally, he served on the Florida Constitution and Bylaws Committee, Redistricting Committee and the Convention Nominating Committee.

Thomas earned his bachelor's degree in philosophy from St. Bernard Abbey in 1966. He attended American University from 1967-1969 in pursuit of a graduate degree in counseling psychology. An avid gardener, he received certification as a Master Gardener from the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences and authors The Green Thumb, a monthly newsletter distributed to 50,000 people in Hernando County, Fla. A member of the American Psychological Association, Thomas is married to his wife Arlette, and they have four children.



Jessica Klement Advocacy Staff Vice President

Jessica Klement is the legislative director of the National Active and Retired Federal Employees Association (NARFE) and is responsible for carrying out the legislative and political strategies of the nation's largest federal employee and retiree organization. As the association's chief lobbyist, she is responsible for taking NARFE members' concerns to Congress.

Prior to joining NARFE, Klement served as the Government and Public Affairs director at the Federal Managers Association, a membership organization representing the interests of the over 200,000 managers and supervisors in the federal government. In this role, she worked closely with members of Congress and their staffs to draft legislation to strengthen federal employee and retiree benefits, including the allowance of credit for unused sick leave at the time of retirement for employees in the Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS). She previously worked for Congressman Tom Petri, R-WI, handling issues relating to the House Judiciary Committee.

Klement's policy analysis on federal employee issues has been featured in *The Washington Post*, NPR, *USA Today* and the Associated Press. She is a regular guest on Federal News Radio and frequently contributes insight on breaking federal employee news to the *Federal Times* and *Government Executive*.

A native of Wisconsin, Klement has a Bachelor of Science degree in Political Science and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Finance from Marquette University, and now resides in Washington, DC.



Rodney L. Adelman Region VII Vice President

Rodney L. Adelman was re-elected as the Region VII Vice President by a vote of 214 – 9 at the NARFE National Convention in 2016. He was first elected to the position at the NARFE National Convention in 2014. At that time, he was completing his second term as the President of the Arizona Federation. He previously served two years as the Arizona Federation Executive Vice-President (2009 - 2011) and two years as a District Vice President (2007 - 2009). Rodney has been a member of NARFE since 2001, both as an active Federal employee in Virginia, and as a Federal retiree in Chapter 1789, Sun City West, AZ. He has served his current Chapter as the Chapter President (2009 - 2011), Chapter Secretary (2006 - 2009), and as the Legislative Officer/NARFE-PAC Chair (2009 - 2013). Rodney served on the National By-laws Committee at the 2010 and 2014 National Conventions, and on the National Legislative Committee at the 2012 National Convention. He also served as a member of the Future of NARFE Committee.

Rodney retired (CSRS) in mid-2005 as the Deputy Executive Officer, Antitrust Division, U.S. Dept. of Justice, having completed nearly 36 years of Federal service. Rodney's Civil Service career began in the summer of 1969, at the Hyattsville, MD, post office. Along the way, he held positions in the US Senate (1970 - 1973) and the Departments of Labor (1973 - 1978), Interior (1978 - 1985), Defense (1985 - 1986), Energy (1986 - 1999), and State (1999 - 2001). His duty stations have included Washington, DC; Philadelphia, PA; Baltimore, MD; El Paso, TX; Saipan, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (US); and Ponape (now Pohnpei), Federated States of Micronesia (formerly Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands).

Rodney's Federal career initially focused on budget and financial management, then Congressional liaison, and finally administration and management. He graduated from the Univ. of Maryland - College Park, majoring in Finance, and continued Public Administration graduate studies at George Washington University in Washington, DC.






