This is also the deadline for submitting Bylaws and Rules Amendments, which will be considered by the Bylaws

NARFE Colorado Federation Legislative Report

Susan Tabacheck, National Vice President Legislation

NARFE Congressional District Leader (CDL 4) Nicolas Cresanta invited Representative Lauren Boebert and her District Director, McKenna Farley, to the Denver City Capitol Meeting on October 17th and confirmed.

As Colorado Federation Legislative VP, I attended Congressman Crow's and Senator Bennett's Town Hall on August 20,

2025. I wasn't able to ask my question, but both Representatives discussed the hardships that Federal workers in all agencies were going through. Two retired Federal workers who were able to ask a question were acknowledged as Civil Servants with a thank you from both Representatives.

As Federal Employees, we can't stop letting our Representatives know about the Bills in Congress listed below. Currently, we cannot afford to be complacent. Under Advocacy in NARFE online, you have the ability to send emails directly to your Representatives. The system pulls up your designated Rep. H.R. 3547/S. 1861, not signed by our Representatives or Senators. Service member Health Freedom Act.

To amend title 10, United States Code, to allow members of the Selected Reserve and National Guard holding employment within the Federal Government the choice between military and civilian healthcare plans, and for other purposes.

H.R. 1989/S. 918 not signed by our Representatives or Senators

This bill proposes that probationary employees involuntarily separated from their government positions continue their probationary period upon

H.R. 491/S. 694 Equal Cola Act, not signed by our Senators

(CO 2) Congressman Joe Neguse is the only co-sponsor of this Bill

This bill applies a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for annuities paid under the Federal Employees Retirement System that is equal to the increase in inflation, regardless of the amount of the increase.

H.R. 492 - Saving the Civil Service Act, Congresswoman Diana DeGette is the only co-sponsor of this Bill.

There is not a Senate Bill related.

It prohibits the placement of competitive service positions into the excepted service, with limited exceptions for schedules already in effect as of September 30, 2020. It limits the number of employees that can be transferred from the competitive to the excepted service during a presidential term. It requires written consent from employees before they can be transferred from the competitive service to the excepted service.

H.R. 493 – FAIR Act, Diana DeGette is the only co-sponsor of this Bill.

This bill modifies pay rates for federal employees in 2026. Specifically, the bill increases rates under the statutory pay systems and for prevailing rate employees by 3.3% and increases locality pay by 1%.

S.126 – Fair Act, not signed by our Representatives or Senators.

Social Security Updates and Resources

In honor of Social Security's 90th anniversary, I am pleased to share some valuable Social Security updates and resources to help the public access our many programs and services.

Changes to our In-Person Services:

Social Security now requires customers to schedule an appointment for service in our field offices, including requests for Social Security cards. We encourage customers to become accustomed to our:

- online services, where many transactions can be completed conveniently and securely, and
- automated services available on our National 800# at 1-800-772-1213.

Customers who are not able to handle their business online or with the automated options, may call their local Social Security office or our National 800# to schedule an appointment.

Replacing Your Social Security Card Online:

Learning how to get a replacement lost or stolen Social Security number (SSN) card has never been easier. Customers can request a replacement SSN card online. There's no need to sit in traffic and visit a local office or Card Center. As long as customers are only requesting a replacement card, and no other changes, they can use our free online services anytime, anywhere. All customers need to do is log in to or create their personal my Social Security account at SSA.gov/mysocialsecurity.

To help assist the public with obtaining their Social Security Card, we have created the "Need a Social Security card?" QR Code poster that can be displayed in public facing areas. After scanning the QR Code, applicants are routed directly into the online application to start or complete their request. Please see attached PDF.

My Social Security Account Enhancements:

A free and secure my Social Security account provides personalized tools for everyone, whether customers receive benefits or not. Customers can use their account to request a Social Security card, check the status of an application, estimate future benefits, upload documents and submit online forms, or manage the benefits you already receive. Other my Social Security services include:

- Get personalized retirement benefit estimates
- Get estimates for spouse's benefits
- Get proof that you do not receive benefits
- Check your application status
- Get your Social Security Statement

With an account, customers can opt to receive available notices online instead of by mail and select to receive email or text alerts when a notice is available. We learned ElderWatch is a partnership between AARP and the Colorado Attorney General's Office in existence for over 20 years. They are totally staffed by volunteers, taking 200 calls per month.

In addition to providing fraud education and outreach across Colorado, they promote financial literacy among older adults. The organization works nationally through the AARP Fraud Watch Network.

In his presentation, Mr. Fetterhoff reminded us of some of the proactive steps we can take to "avoid fraud, identity theft and the many millions of criminals out there who are after your money and personal information daily!"

Loretta Knauf, Chapter 1072 Alzheimer's Chair, coordinated the presentation given by Mr. Ron Uchida of the Alzheimer's Association at the chapter's September 8, 2025, meeting. Ron had given Part 1 of "Healthy Living for Your Brain and Body" at the June 2, 2025, meeting. In Part 2, Ron reviewed and expanded upon the scope of the Information he presented earlier.

He discussed the risk factors and how to mitigate them, as well as diagnoses, stages, current treatments, and ongoing research. Since Ron's uncle was afflicted with Alzheimer's disease, Ron is participating in a clinical study examining his medical history as he ages.

Debbie Rodgers, Colorado Federation and Chapter 1072 Vice President for Membership, and I will soon be planning our strategy for our chapter's participation in the federation's health fairs. I want to give kudos to chapter officers, George Cook, Treasurer, Susan Tabacheck, Colorado Federation, and Chapter 1072 Vice President for Legislation, Debbie Rodgers, and Jim Seaman, Secretary, for their consistent hard work this year.
